WELCOME TO THIS MONTH'S NEWSLETTER:

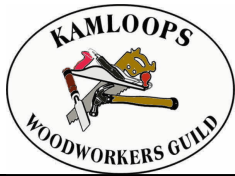

- Keith C has a table saw that varies its width during a cut. He needs help...

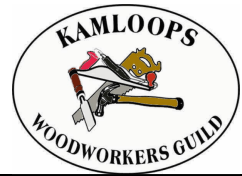

- **Larry Jordan** – Showed his maple burl turned bowl... really nice grains in it.

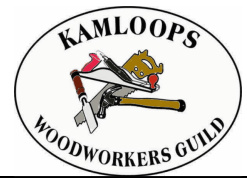


- **NOTE:** Larry needs help with a large band saw to be able to cut another burl piece.

- **Tom Currie** – Aged alder turned bowl... nice dark “red” colouring; and a cherry natural edge turned bowl.

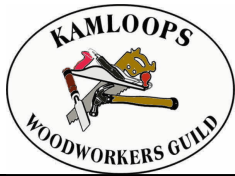


- **Derry Appleton** –cedar bowl with a void on one side.. Very nicely done.



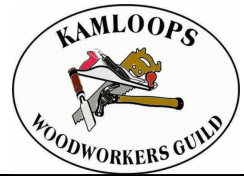
- **Jerry Gauthier** – Oak memorial urn (box) with a glass top piece with a viewing area for knick-knacks of the occupant of the back urn area....
