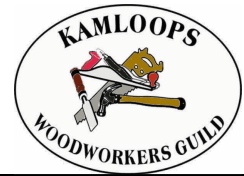

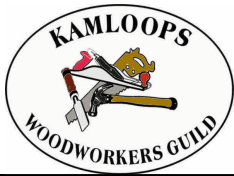

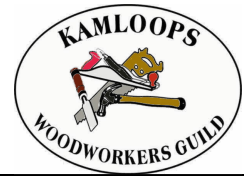
## ANNOUNCEMENTS:

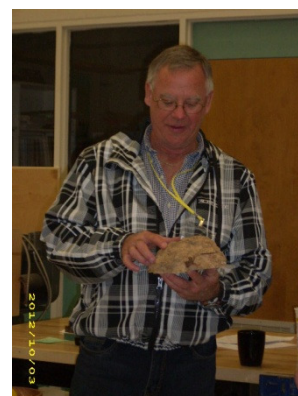


- **Terry Shupe** – Showed his school bus with passengers in it and explained how he made it.





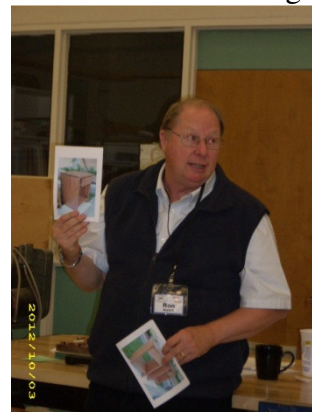
- **Tom Currie** – Turned black walnut bowl and a piece of cottonwood burl that he wanted suggestions on what to do with it.



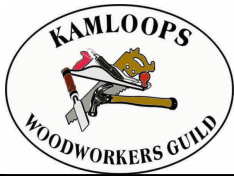
- **Nic V** – Nice Catalpa wood bowl, from a harvest last year.

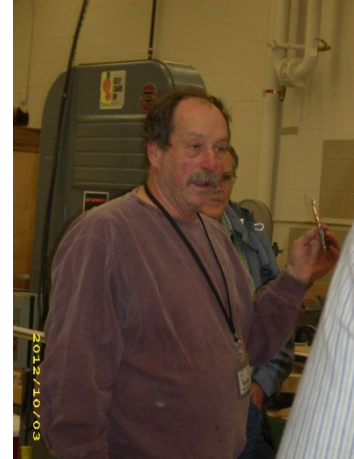


- **Keith McBratney** – Showed us his jig for routing different pieces, like cupboard door trim, etc. Also showed his first turned cartridge pen.

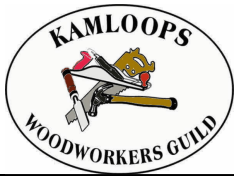
- **Mike Pease** – Showed us photos of the boat he started to build in April. Looks great and it even floats...

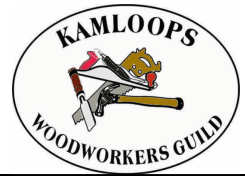


- **Dave Agar** – Showed three bowls – 1 was of black walnut, and then there was a small myrtle wood bowl, and a “norra” wood bowl
