- Visitor from New Brunswick and his daughter has a B&B at Whitecroft Village....


TRU BURSARY Carl Ottosen

NAME TAG ROUND UP: Dave Agar


Dave A.; went all around the room inspecting and getting the stories of the different types, and styles of name tags. Lots of variety, and smart ideas for tags.

• Francis Shuter – Showed some wooden cars, matching his name tag, made of Indian Maple wood.


