* WHEEL & AXELS ORDER:

After much discussion on when and who was to order the wheels & axels, it was decided that Stu Rockwood would order them to a maximum of **\$350.00** total.

Added Dave Agar's name to the Volunteer list for toy making Work Bee.

* TURNING SEMINAR REPORT: Carl Ottosen, Denis Biron, Les Eliason & Dave Agar The main demonstrator was Kai Muenzer from Calgary who is an excellent turner, he is a perfectionist, had very good tool control and I would refer to him as an artistic turner. He turned a 3 sectional tilted lid box, a bud vase with an offset foot, a round lidded box with sliding door. Art Betke from Prince George showed us how to dye a vase using black, blue, red and yellow aniline dye. Once dry he puts on 8 coats of WOP. Ken Turner from Prince George showed us how he made antelope horns; first he would make a 18" long pointed cylinder, mark it off in 1"sections, take this to the band saw which had the table tilted and mitre gauge set at an angle; he now cut the cylinder into biscuits at the 1" markings. Different but interesting. Next George Thompson from Quesnel made a hollow round Christmas ornament. He told us of a food safe recipe for bowls they have developed using a mixture of Sunflower Oil, carnauba wax, and distilled bees wax.

They had three cameras set up on the lathe which were projected onto a large screen. They had small instant gallery anyone could bring some of their turning and display them. There were some very nice and interesting turnings. They sold tickets for a draw on three big items. They also had a number of donated items and drew names out of a hat; everyone went away with a couple of things. P&D Taylor industries from Mission had good selection of wood for sale;

turning blanks and other pieces of wood. Prices were very reasonable. Ken Rude from Calgary, the rep for Vicmarc, had a mini Vicmarc lathe, a number of chucks and handle tools; a little pricey.

There was lots of food and drinks, nice shop; unpadded chairs were a little hard on backside at the end of the day. Over all it was well done a one got your money's worth.
