- Anne R. got a Craftsman lathe
  - Also had some black walnut from her yard milled up at a cost of approx.
     \$100 works out to \$10/person for anyone who got some
  - Dave G. had broken the depth stop knob off of his Veritas plow plane
    - Veritas is going to send him a new knob and cam free of charge
  - Anne R. showed a picture of the broken brander to Lee Valley
    - o They thought it needs a new iron, and said they could fix it
    - If anyone is going down to Coquitlam area it would be great if they can take it along

### 4) KMS TOOLS DEMO DAY:

- Had reasonable turnout, even with the weather
- Next year we may try to do it in the summer, or at least earlier in the year before the weather gets too chilly

## 5) OLD BUSINESS:

- Anne R. had an impromptu meeting with Home Depot
  - There is a new process for approval for materials for community groups, which requires plenty of notice
  - We now need to let them know what materials we need by early January
- Les E. has set us up with the KMS Tools rewards program
  - 2% of all purchases by included Guild members will go back onto the Guild account
  - This money will be used to purchase gift cards for the end of year BBQ, etc.

- We were in the Craft Fair on Saturday Nov. 9 at the Westsyde Fellowship Hall
  - We were selling items that were leftover from Canada Day, as well as any extra donations people may have had
